#### WARMING UP A WINTER'S DAY

This month we are treated to the artistry of one of our most accomplished members – **Kathy** *Suiyu* **Toy** from Ohara School. Kathy has combined her artistic talent and scholarship in many endeavors and we gratefully benefit from her commitment to ikebana and our chapter. She is an Associate First Degree Master of Ohara School of Ikebana. Kathy is one of our valued members who never refuses a request, accepting with grace and enthusiasm anything we send her way. She currently is I.I.'s Publicity Chair and produces internet web announcements each month, as well as materials for many chapter events.

In 1988 she lived in Japan and began daily lessons at the Ohara School. She became enamored by the art, combining it with her lifelong interest in design and plants. When she returned to the USA she continued to study and occasionally traveled to Tokyo for classes. She became a founding board member of the North American Ohara Teachers Association for four years and a member of the board of the Ohara School of Ikebana Northern California Chapter. She also belongs to Ikebana International and the Ikebana Teachers Federation. She studies regularly with Grand Master Kayoko *Suiyo* Fujimoto.

Kathy often demonstrates and exhibits ikebana. Some venues which have shown her work are the De Young Museum, Hakone Gardens, Filoli, San Francisco Cherry Blossom Festival, and ikebana events elsewhere in California, New York, and Florida.

Born in Kentucky and was raised there and in Colorado, Kathy also lived two years in the Philippines. She lived in Rochester, NY for 24 years and during that time spent a year in Tokyo with her husband. Since 2000 she has been a resident of San Jose. She was educated at Michigan State University in Interior Design and did graduate work at the University of Central

Florida. She also studied Mechanical Engineering at Rochester Institute of Technology. For 39 years she was employed as an interior designer specializing in commercial work. Kathy currently edits English translations for Ohara's magazines *Kikyo* and *Soka*.
