LET'S WELCOME SPRINGTIME TOGETHER

Spring, the season many of us love the best, has arrived and we welcome the appearance of **Sumi Metz** for our March program. With her deep understanding and thorough knowledge of ikebana, Sumi is well known for her vibrant, fascinating creations. She always brings a spirit of joy and beauty to the stage when she demonstrates. Often inspiring her audience, she shows us new ways to see and use a wide spectrum of materials in ikebana.

In 2000 Aratame Headmaster Seigyo Aratame invited Sumi to join his then-fledgling school which was founded in 1993. Aratame School began attracting students in this country and, recognizing Sumi's artistic talent and business acumen, the Headmaster asked her to become his assistant and appointed her President of Aratame Ryu USA. Prior to this Sumi studied Wafu ikebana for nearly three decades, earning her Senior Professor rank in that school.

Born and raised in Nagasaki-ken, Japan, the young Sumi was fascinated watching her sister arrange flowers at home. She developed her lifelong love of flowers which was further refined in cultural education classes at school.

After moving to California with her husband in 1965 Sumi settled first in San Francisco and later moved to San Jose. During her early years here she raised her son and daughter and studied English. She also owned and operated a popular restaurant for 14 years. She joined Ikebana International in 1980 and has served on the board of directors several times. She also is a member of the Ikebana Teachers Federation.

Sumi maintains an impressive and busy schedule, often demonstrating and exhibiting for I.I. as well as schools, businesses and other organizations in the Bay Area. Her work has been seen at the Asian Art Museum, the San Francisco Flower and Garden Show, Bouquets to Art at the de

Young Museum, and the San Francisco Cherry Blossom Festival. She also has exhibited in Paris, Toronto, Canada, Monterey, CA. A special honor came when she was selected as the Oversea Member Demonstrator for I.I.'s 9th World Convention in Tokyo. She also provides ikebana instruction for schoolchildren in Cupertino.
