A THRILLING SEASON FINALE THE THEATRE OF YUGEN PERFORMS ON STAGE

The renowned Theatre of Yugen comes to our stage on May 18. This is a "Must See" program! In keeping with our goal of presenting one program each season which enlarges our appreciation and enjoyment of Japanese arts and culture, The Theatre of Yugen will present two legendary Japanese folk tales: "Kagyu" (Snail) performed in English. In addition we will see excerpts from "Hagoromo" (Feathered Robe), performed in the traditional way with a dancer, chorus and two musicians. Performers also will give a brief talk and demonstration about Noh and Kyogen drama – the costumes, staging, stories, music, etc. This will be a wonderful end to the season, so please come and bring your friends. For more than six centuries *Nohgaku* has been the oldest, continuously presented theatrical tradition worldwide. The Theatre of Yugen has been based in San Francisco for more than 30 years. It is an award winning company known and acclaimed nationally and internationally. It is the only troupe in the USA dedicated to the performance and training of *Nohgaku* actors assembled from many countries. Whether an individual show is classical or contemporary, the company strives to project the aesthetic quality of yugen – a mysterious elegance – to give the work a distinctive style and provide a unique experience for the audience.

Traditional stories of comical, romantic and frightening situations come to colorful life in these plays which are rich with dancing, elaborate costumes, drums and flutes, singing, and masks expressing every aspect of human emotion.

This program ends our 2011-2012 season. During the summer, outgoing and incoming board members will meet to plan the next season which begins on Friday, September 21, 2012.
