Sogetsu Holiday Magic Is Unveiled on Stage And Bazaar Tables Offer the Season's Bounty

Kimi *Kika* **Shibata**, one of our most accomplished and admired Sogetsu teachers, brings us a joyful program on December to celebrate the holidays. She is known for her great creativity and exuberant ikebana. Kika teaches many ikebana classes throughout the greater Bay Area and has a large and devoted group of students. In 1996 she accepted a leadership role as Regional Director of Sogetsu North America and in 2003 she became the Director of the Sogetsu San Jose – South Bay Branch. Needless to say, she is a woman with unbounded energy and skill, and this is reflected in her ikebana.

She began learning ikebana at age four from her mother, Shoka Narimatsu, a master of Sogetsu ikebana. After moving to the USA as a teenager she continued her studies with her mother and also in Japan with Kasumi Teshigahara, a future Sogetsu Iemoto.

Kika received her teaching certificate and flower name in 1967. By March 1989 she earned the title *Riji*, the highest degree offered by Sogetsu. She presents the work of her students in flower shows each year and is a frequent demonstrator and exhibitor for Ikebana International and for many other organizations. In May 2008 she was a featured demonstrator at I.I.'s North American Regional Conference in Monterey, CA. She conducts workshops and gives demonstrations throughout the country and in Japan. On the occasion of Sogetsu's 80th anniversary Kika was awarded the Sogetsu International Award. She continues to be actively involved in teaching ikebana to both children and adults in her community.

- ★Bring your containers before 10 a.m. They must be clean and in good condition.
- ★ Make out a sales slip at the silent auction table with your name, any information about the container, and a suggested sales price. We'll handle the rest for you.

When the sale closes, all donors and buyers should go to the auction tables where buyers should pay the donor for the container. If the container was not sold, the donor should remove it. We ask each donor to give 20% of the sales price to I.I.
