## ADELICATE ART -- BALANCING FLOWERS

No kenzan? No problem! Come to the program on February 20 and watch **ThanhKosen Nguyen** create Hanakubari – the challenging art of balancing flowers and branches without using a kenzan.

**Thanh Nguyen** is the chapter's immediate past president and last summer she went to Tokyo for several weeks to study Hanakubari at the renowned Mami Flower Design School. On February 20 she demonstrates this style of arranging, revealing a technique which may be new to many of us. Drawing on her years of training, Thanh holds teaching degrees in two schools -- Wafukai and Sogetsu -- and last year she initiated the chapter's Ikebana for Youth workshop program in local schools.

Born in Vietnam to a family of artists, Thanh was introduced to ikebana at an early age but began her formal studies after arriving in the USA. While raising two daughters, she attended night school and graduated San Jose State University with degrees in Marketing and Engineering. For 25 years she worked in the high tech industry. After retiring she directed her energies to teaching ikebana in Palo Alto and Menlo Park and in a senior program in Palo Alto. In 2014 she led a team which updated the chapter's website and she continues to serve on the chapter's board of directors as Liaison for I.I.'s North American Region. The most recent issue of the Ikebana International Magazine includes a feature article on the Ikebana for Youth workshop program.

Thanh'sstunning ikebana has been displayed in many exhibitions, demonstration programs, flower shows, and museums. She has exhibited at Bouquets to Art at the de Young Fine Arts Museum, the Asian Art Museum, and at Filoli Gardens. She also has exhibited internationally in Paris, Vietnam, and in Manila. She enjoys

many other hobbies which include her garden, the symphony and opera, movies, painting, playing the Chinese harp, biking, and her family pets.
