Sharon Krawetz holds Wafukai's *Gakukan* degree and is a Vice President of the California Wafukai Chapter. She studies with Fusako Seiga Hoyrup. Sharon also is a Past President of Ikebana International and currently is Chair of the Chapter's upcoming 2015 Flower Show.

She started arranging flowers as a teenager but when her flowers fell out of the vase, she started watching others and eventually sought lessons. Even after nearly 40 years of flower arranging, Sharon still finds inspiration in ikebana. She feels it is never repetitive since there are always new ways of combining materials and containers. She enjoys the concentration required while arranging and the joy of working with fresh flowers. She often has demonstrated and exhibited for the chapter and at various community events. Sharon is also a member of the Ikebana Teachers Federation.

Tova Matatyaou came to the USA in 1977 with her husband and son. She began ikebana classes in 1982 and continues to study with Fusako Seiga Hoyrup. Tova holds the high teaching rank of *Shukan* and began teaching in 1988. She has a devoted group of students and they treasure Tova's gentle and lucid ikebana instruction. She leads them to explore the natural beauty of flowers and plants and the importance of harmony linking flowers, vase, and the environment in ikebana.

She has been a member of this I.I. Chapter for many years and also is a board member of the Ikebana Teachers Federation. Through the years she has exhibited and demonstrated in many ikebana shows and community events. In addition to ikebana, Tova enjoys gardening, beading and knitting.
