A HEADMISTRESS AND HER DAUGHTER BRING THE ELEGANCE OF ENSHU ISSHINKAI

In May we are honored to present Mme. Fumie *Ichifu* Meikyo, Headmistress of Enshu Isshinkai, and her daughter, Reiko *Ichirei* Meikyo. They lead a school noted for great refinement and rooted in traditional Japanese culture.

Fumie *Ichifu* Meikyo began her ikebana studies at age 14 with the late Headmaster Isshin Mori. In 2009 she became the fourth Iemoto of the school. Her daughter, Reiko *Ichirei* Meikyo, began studies with Mr. Mori when she was in junior high school and now holds Enshu's highest teaching certificate. Both mother and daughter have visited San Francisco in the past, assisting Mr. Mori when he gave programs and workshops here which were enjoyed with much enthusiasm.

Enshu School of Ikebana was founded by Kobori Enshu in the 17th century. It is one of the most esteemed schools of traditional ikebana. Several designs are taught in the school but it is particularly noted for fashioning a sturdy, straight branch into a delicately curved line. Using intricate cuts and wedges, designs of graceful lines are created. The technique is difficult to master and requires years of study to master. Enshu Isshinkai also is known for creating works which evoke Mt. Fuji, Japan's beloved mountain.

Headmistress Meikyo has taught ikebana for 45 years. In her role as Iemoto, she most recently demonstrated in 2010 for the Los Angeles chapter of I.I. She also has presented programs in Houston TX and abroad in Italy, Turkey, Lithuania, Korea, Russia and Pakistan. In Japan Headmistress Meikyo's work is shown in museums, public buildings, and shrines. She and her daughter also practice the Enshu School of Tea Ceremony.
