Kayoko *Suiyo* Fujimoto, Ohara School Nobu Kurashige, Ikenobo Ikebana Michiko Hosoda, Chiko School Sumi Metz, Aratame School

Fusako Seiga Hoyrup, Wafu School Yusui Joan Suzuki, Sogetsu School

Kayoko *Suiyo* **Fujimoto** is a Grandmaster of the Ohara School. She has led a large and devoted group of Ohara teachers and students for six decades. Included in a long history of accomplishments and honors are the Order of the Rising Sun, Golden and Silver Rays, from the government of Japan. In 2008 she was inducted into the Bunka Hall of Fame in recognition of her lifelong contributions to Ikebana and Japanese cultural arts.

Michiko Hosoda studied with Chiko Soke Kobai Naruse and Headmistress Kosen Naruse in Japan in 2006 and earned their permission to teach Chiko Ikebana in the United States. Her classes in Chiko Ikebana reflect her academic experience and study in other schools of Ikebana. She has a deep history of community

involvement. She worked as a Learning Specialist in the Sunnyvale School District for 20 years and volunteers at senior centers.

Fusako *Seiga* **Hoyrup** is President of the Wafu School of Ikebana, California Chapter. She holds Wafukai's highest teaching degree of *Shukan*. She studied in Japan with the late Headmaster Wafu Teshigahara. She has staged and managed many large Wafu flower shows and has earned community awards for her work. She was named the Distinguished Artist of the Year in 1995 and Asian American Hero in 2004.

Nobu Kurashige is Professor of Ikenobo Ikebana and became Managing Directgor of the Ikenobo Ikebana Society of America in 2010. She has traveled widely demonstrating and exhibiting Ikebana in more than 50 countries, often at the request of the Japanese government. She holds a Master's Degree in International Culture from Yamaguchi Prefectural University and has taught at the Ikenobo Junior College in Kyoto and lectured at Doshisha University.

Sumi Metz is President of Aratame USA. She has studied and taught Ikebana for more than 30 years and during those three decades she has been an active member of this chapter, demonstrating, exhibiting, and serving in various positions on the board of directors, currently Chair for Ikebana Supplies. She has presented programs throughout California, as well as Toronto, Canada and Paris. She also is a member of the Ikebana Teachers Federation.

Yusui Joan Suzuki holds Sogetsu School's highest rank of *Riji* and is Director Emeritus of Sogetsu San Francisco Branch. She is a charter member of this chapter and the Ikebana Teachers Federation. She has been an active participant in Sogetsu's biennial flower shows. In 2013 she received the Bunka Hall of Fame Award from the Japan America Association. She received the Sogetsu Honor Award at Sogetsu's 80th Anniversary Ceremony in Tokyo.

This extraordinary program brings us together after the summer recess to enjoy the beauty of Ikebana and reunite with our friends following the program.
