Look for amusing surprises and fresh, new ideas as these adventuresome members take unusual materials in hand for holiday ikebana.

Nancy Carlson has studied Chiko Ikebana with both Michiko Hosoda and now with Christina Schuknecht. She has chaired a program for the chapter, served as speaker for demonstrators, and exhibited in chapter flower shows.

Margaret Kurasaki first studied Ikenobo Ikebana in Japan and now studies locally. In 2010 Margaret's arrangement won Best of Show at the California Floral Association Show. She holds offices in the Ikebana Teachers Federation and the Northern California Chapter of Ikenobo Ikebana Society.

Luciana Mazzola has studied Wafu Ikebana for 30 years, currently with Fusako Hoyrup. She holds Wafu-kai's 2nd year teaching certificate. She has exhibited at many flower shows and the San Francisco Cherry Blossom Festival.

Martina Roethig holds Sogetsu's Jonin Sanyo teaching certificate and studies with Kika Shibata. She is a member of the Sogetsu Teachers Association, the Sogetsu San Jose-South Bay Branch, and the Ikebana Teachers Federation.

Toshiko Shaw has trained in Ikenobo, Wafu, and Aratame schools. She holds teaching degrees from each school and has exhibited frequently for Ikebana International and at many events in her community.

Yoko Tahara studies with Ohara Grandmaster Suiyo Fujimoto and holds a 2nd Masters Degree. She also designs and maintains websites for this I.I. chapter and for North America Ohara Teachers Association. She often exhibits ikebana for Ikebana International.

- ★ Deliver your donations between 10-10:30 a.m. to allow time for display.
- ★ Sales will begin at 11 a.m. and continue until 12 noon. No sales will be made
- during the demonstration program, but will resume afterward.
- ★ Bring small bills and change. No credit card sales.

Sales tables will be filled with donations brought by members and manned by volunteer salespeople. Holiday greens and decorative materials will be offered, as well as handcrafted and knitted items, flowers and orchids, wreaths, special holiday foods packaged for giving, jewelry, baked goods, and delicious luncheon foods will be available.

Lucky winners of **The Raffle** will take home a container made and donated by Shuji Ikeda, Gordon Ward or Irene Jenkins – three accomplished potters and ikebana artists who have generously donated containers. See Raffle Chair Joan Finnie to buy your tickets.

The **Container Silent Auction** will offer containers in excellent shape but which owners no longer use. Many wonderful buys are available here. Only clean vases in perfect condition are accepted at the Auction. If you wish to auction a container check in with Auction Chair Carole Gray and make out an auction form for the item. When the auction is finished, all sellers and buyers must go to the Auction Table and complete the transaction in person. Buyers pay the seller directly. If a container is not sold, the owner must remove it.

Each seller is asked to donate 20% of the selling price to the chapter. This may be done immediately at the Auction Table or by mailing a check payable to "Ikebana International" to Fiona Li, Treasurer; 530 Cherry Avenue, San Bruno, CA 94066. THE 2013 IKEBANA FLOWER Saturday and Sunday, March 16 & 17, 2013

Open your new 2013 calendar and mark the dates for the Ikebana Flower Show next March. And please also reserve some time to volunteer during the staging/set-up days before, during or after closing. Remember that all exhibitors are required to volunteer for at least one shift before, during or at the close of the show. There are many different volunteer assignments and shifts available. To get the assignment and shift you desire, send in your Volunteer Sign-Up Form early!

Remember that only those whose current dues are paid before December 31, 2012 and are members may exhibit at the Show.

By now you have received a large white envelope marked "Important Flower Show Information". Inside is the Entry Form for your arrangement(s), Guidelines and Information for Exhibitors, the Volunteer Sign-Up Form, ten admission tickets to buy and sell; and a letter from President Nguyen. Here are important <u>deadline dates</u> for your new calendar:

December 31, 2012	Dues must be paid by this date in order to enter arrangements.
February 1, 2013	Last date to return Volunteer Sign-Up Form to Ron Brown.
February 2, 2013	Last date to submit Entry Form to Carole Gray.
March 15, 2013	Install arrangements between 10:00 a.m. – 8:00 p.m.

Flower Show Chair Mitsuko Maruyama urges you to read the Information Package carefully to be fully informed about the show. If you have any questions call her at (510) 494-8220 or email <u>MitsMaruyama@gmail.com</u>. You are encouraged to enter one or more arrangements, regardless of your level of accomplishment, whether you are a beginner or credentialed teacher. This is an opportunity for every member to exhibit in a professionally staged exhibition which attracts thousands of residents and visitors. Many who attend are unfamiliar with ikebana but our docents help them to learn and fully enjoy the show. The demonstrations are always "sold out", sometimes with standing room only when our very accomplished artists demonstrate in the Art-In-Action programs.

<u>The sale of admission tickets by members is a very important, fundraising part of the show</u>. Proceeds provide funding for programs until the next show, two years hence. So please become an ikebana salesperson; buy your tickets and then either give them as gifts or sell them. If you cannot buy or sell some of your tickets, please return them, as instructed in President Nguyen's letter. Remember that "tickets = money", the much needed funds for our future programs.
