TWO OHARA ARTISTS WELCOME SPRING

A hint of early springtime blossoms in February when two accomplished Ohara School arrangers come on stage to demonstrate. Both have been students and teachers for many years and their polished artistry is often seen locally. They are active members of the North American Ohara Teachers Association, the Suiyo Flower Club, and the Ikebana Teachers Federation, as well as this chapter of I.I.

Mitsuko *Suiko* **Maruyama** is well known to us as a Past President of the chapter and a leader of Ohara School in the Bay Area. Born in Ohita, Japan, she came to the USA at age 15. She began studying with Ohara Grandmaster Kayoko *Suiyo* Fujimoto in 1971 and continues under her guidance today. She received her Teachers Certificate in July 1977 and in 2008 she was named First Term Master.

After a career in banking, during which she managed a bank, Mitsuko retired and has devoted herself to ikebana since then. Since 2000 she has served as President of the Ohara Ikebana School of Northern California Chapter. She served as President of I.I. San Francisco Bay Area Chapter from 2001-2003, again in 2007-2009, and now holds the office of Treasurer. She demonstrates and exhibits in Ohara and I.I. Flower Shows, the Cherry Blossom Festival, museums and department stores.

Mitsuko *Suiko* **Umemoto** is a Retail Florist, having received her Retail Florist Certificate from San Francisco City College in 1988. She was born in Himeji-shi, Japan, and after coming to California has studied Ohara ikebana with Grandmaster Kayoko *Suiyo* Fujimoto since 1976. She received her Teachers Certificate in 2000 and the Second Term Master rank in 2012. She is a resident of El Cerrito.

Mitsuko volunteers at the Kimichi Senior Center in San Francisco. In addition to her ikebana affiliations noted above, she demonstrates and exhibits for I.I., the Cherry Blossom Festival exhibition presented by the Ikebana Teachers Federation, and has exhibited at the San Francisco Asian Art Museum.
