BRIGHTEN WINTER WITH IKEBANA IN YOUR HOME

Three accomplished Sogetsu arrangers from the Monterey Bay Chapter come onstage in February to create ikebana for the home. They will inspire us to make arrangements to refresh and enliven our homes, lifting our spirits during dark and dreary winter days.

Betty Jetter first studied ikebana in Japan when she moved there with her husband in 1996. She says her years there were some of the best of her life, making many friends while enjoying ikebana and also studying Chigiri-e, Sumi-e, and other Japanese arts. When she moved back to California they settled in Pebble Beach. Betty immediately saw an announcement about a meeting of the Monterey Bay Chapter of Ikebana International and became an active member. She studied Sogetsu Ikebana with Carol Marchette and June Matsuoka. She also studied Ikenobo Ikebana for one year with Shuji Ikeda.

In 2014 she gave her first solo demonstration of 12 arrangements. She has been President of the Monterey Bay Chapter and served as Program Chair for the 2008 North American

Regional Conference hosted by the Chapter. She is also a member of Sogetsu South Bay Branch, Sogetsu San Francisco Bay Branch, and an Associate Member of the San Francisco I.I. Chapter. Betty has led workshops of Chigiri-e in San Francisco, Sacramento and Monterey.

Betty is a Registered Nurse and has worked in many nursing assignments. She was a volunteer for the Red Cross for 25 years, including work with new immigrants from Viet Nam at the end of the war.

Carol Marchette remembers her mother's garden as a child and recalls the importance of flowers in their lives. That love of flowers has remained with her. After college she married a geologist and they moved to assignments in California, Alaska and Texas and later they lived in Indonesia, France, Iran and Saudi Arabia. Her multi-cultural experiences are an important element of her ikebana study and teaching.

Carol lived in Bangkok and Singapore and recalls making new friends when she began studying Sogetsu and Ohara Ikebana. She says it is not easy to move to a foreign country and make new friends, but she found that I.I. was "the perfect bridge to great people in a new community". In addition to Sogetsu and Ohara, Carol also studies Ikenobo Ikebana and holds teaching certificates from the three schools.

After returning to the USA in 1985 she joined I.I. in San Francisco and became a founding member of the Monterey Bay chapter of I.I. in 1988. She has performed many leading roles in Chapter activities. She served as Chair for the 2008 North American Regional Conference hosted by Monterey Bay Chapter. Carol now teaches ikebana at her home. She often exhibits and demonstrates for local organizations. She is an Associate Member of the San Francisco I.I. Chapter.

June Matsuoka holds the rank of *Riji*, Sogetsu School's highest teaching rank. Her ikebana name is *Junpo*. She began studying ikebana in 1955. After moving to the USA she continued her ikebana studies and earned her Teacher's Certificate in 1979. She has studied with Shoka Narimatsu sensei in San Jose and also attended classes given by Soho Sakai sensei at City College of San Francisco.

June worked until age 70 at a bank, AT&T, and the Japanese Community Center. A resident of Campbell, June taught Sogetsu Ikebana in Salinas and the Oldemeyer Community Center in Seaside for several years. She now teaches at her home. She has participated in workshops for elementary school children on Valentine's Day and Mother's Day events in Carmel, Salinas, Monterey, Pebble Beach and Seaside.

June has given many workshops, demonstrations and exhibits at museums, flower shows, and hospices. She has installed ikebana exhibits at the Monterey Peninsula Buddhist Temple, Bouquets to Art at the de Young Museum, Santa Clara County Fair, I.I. San Francisco Chapter, Soho Study Group flower shows, Sogetsu San Francisco Branch, and the Ikebana Teachers Federation.

In February, when the weather often keeps us inside our homes, our sister Chapter Monterey Bay sends us three of their most accomplished arrangers. All three - Betty Jetter, Carol Marchette, and June Matsuoka – are Associate Members of our Chapter and often participate in our programs and flower shows.
