The Ohara School's "Joyful Trío" Demonstrates

We are pleased to welcome to our demonstration stage, three of the Ohara School's most talented arrangers. The Ohara School is noted for its naturalistic treatment of flowers and arrangements that range from traditional to sculptural. The School originated the Moribana Style arrangement using low, wide containers which has been widely adopted by other schools. Heika style arrangements in tall vases are also frequently arranged. Our trio of arrangers were all born in Japan and we are fortunate to have them with us in the Bay Area. All three arrangers have exhibited and/or demonstrated for I.I., the Cherry Blossom Festival, Ohara Chapter shows as well as other venues. Collectively they have participated in the following organizations: Northern California Ohara Chapter, I.I., and North American Ohara Teachers Association (NAOTA) and Ikebana Teachers Federation.

Yoshiko Gilli

Ms. Gilli holds a 2nd Term Associate Masters' Certificate. and has been studying with Kayoko *Suiyo* Fujimoto since 1989. She was a U.S. Air Force Officer and nurse. Yoshiko Grave


