Christina Schuknecht has always had an interest in Ikebana and her study of the Chiko School of Ikebana in 2005 with her sensei Michiko Hosoda. In 2006 she became a member of I.I., participated in our SF Chapter Flower Shows since 2007, displayed arrangements at many of our meetings, as well as participated in demonstrations for I.I. Jane Naito has studied Ikebana for the past fifteen years with her sensei, Joan Yusui Suzuki and holds her Nikyu Shihan - Sanyo certificate from the Sogetsu School. Jane represented Ikebana International at the de Young Museum's Bouquets to Arts floral exhibit in 2012 and is currently an annual exhibitor at the de Young's annual event. Jane has also exhibits annually at the Filoli Flower Show and at the Cherry Blossom Festival.
